Dear Parish Family,

It is hard to believe that we are fast approaching the end of the church year, but when you look at the church calendar, the church season of ADVENT will begin on Sunday, December 1. During the month of November, we will have several specific opportunities to very intentionally give thanks for the many blessings in our lives this year. The first is ALL SAINTS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 3<sup>RD</sup>. It is a celebration that dates back to 837 when Pope Gregory IV ordered a church wide observance of a commemoration of martyrs who died in groups or whose names were unknown. After the church broke with Rome, it continued to celebrate All Saints Day with the New Testament understanding of the term "saints" meaning all believers. It is the day we set aside to remember and give thanks for all those "saints" or believers, who have passed on to greater life. It is that special time when we remember those who have inspired us, taught us, and guided us to live into our faith. This year we will mark the day with adoption of a new believer into the household of God through the sacrament of the BAPTISM of Christy Dash.

On NOVEMBER 17<sup>TH</sup>, during the regular worship service, we will have an INSTRUCTED EUCHARIST. It will be an opportunity to refresh our memories as to the meaning and symbolism of one of the two major sacraments of the church (the other being Baptism). It is a great time to invite friends or those who may want to learn more about The Episcopal Church, as it explains What We Do, and Why We Do It in the worship service. After the service we will have an informal Q&A Session in the Parish Hall with coffee and cookies.

The national holiday of THANKSGIVING will be on November 28<sup>th</sup>. Early in November you will receive a letter from St. Paul's regarding your Commitment of time, talent and treasure to the church of God for 2025. One question each of us should prayerfully ask ourselves is this: how do we tangibly, individually and as a community of faith, give thanks for the many blessings we have enjoyed in our lives? I think the answer is simply ---we give back ---we strive to be good stewards with our lives following in the steps of saints of old by inspiring, teaching and guiding others in the faith and also sharing in our resources so that others may thrive as well.

On Sunday, NOVEMBER 24, we will have the Ingathering of our Commitments at the Altar. On that day our GUEST PREACHER will be The Rev. Canon Steve Carlsen, Canon For Congregational Vitality. There will be a Covered Dish luncheon immediately after the worship service. Fried Chicken and Baked Ham will be provided by the Vestry. Please bring your favorite side dishes and desserts!

St. Paul's is a special place because each of you individually, and all of us together, have been greatly blessed by God, this place, and each other. I ask that you prayerfully consider the abundance that God has bestowed upon you when determining your commitment for the coming year.
